Effort to Reduce Garbage Truck Traffic Moves Forward

Just a quick update from the WLA ad hoc committee on trash collection . . .

Three additional Winans Lake community households switched to The Garbage Man in the January-March quarter. In the same quarter of 2019, only two residents used The Garbage Man, and now it's 56. But the problem remains: Cowell Road between Chilson and Pleasant Lake still has at least one customer each for five different haulers, though one of the four is being dropped as of June 1st. (Thanks to Al Pelky's hard work, Winans Drive has been more successful in reducing garbage truck traffic.) As we always understood, it was going to be an uphill climb to get residents to agree to use just *one* hauler.

On April 6, committee member Dan Luria presented results of his study of the impacts of garbage trucks on road repairs, air quality, and safety to the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees. The study found that, were the Township to choose 1-3, <u>each with an exclusive route</u>, it could reduce garbage truck traffic, noise, and pollution by more than 60%. Centralized billing through the Township, with the cost baked into property tax bills, could save residents roughly \$760,000 a year and allow the \$1-million roads millage to be reduced to \$764,000, an additional savings of \$236,000, bringing the total savings to nearly a million dollars. While two Board members raised some concerns, the Board voted unanimously to move forward with investigating how such "organized collection" could be managed best in terms of billing and contracting. The first step will be meetings with local cities and townships that already have exclusive routes and centralized billing. Because the outcome and timing of the Township's decision-making cannot be known in advance, however, we should keep up the momentum in our neighborhood. Please ask your neighbors who use haulers with very few neighborhood customers -- including Waste Management, Titan, and Superior -- to consider switching. The committee continues to recommend switching to The Garbage Man, which has the lowest price and most consistent service.
