Water Quality Issues – July 2021

As part of the WLA's ongoing Water Quality Education Initiative, it is important for members to be aware of the issues that other lakes are struggling with due to poor watershed management, as we could soon experience the same problems if we fail to be diligent and proactive.

The majority of water quality problems are caused by improper stormwater and shoreline management. According to MSU, "Erosion of sediment is the most common cause of pollution in Michigan's waters." This is because sediments carry nutrients, bacteria and other pollutants into lakes and streams.

Here is just a brief snapshot of some common water quality problems which we need to continually guard against:

Big Portage Lake - Swimming Advisory

Recently Washtenaw County issued a swimming advisory for Big Portage Lake due to a harmful algae bloom (HAB) which is being tested for microcystins. You can read the <u>advisory here</u> or follow the discussion thread on <u>NextDoor</u>.

10 beaches across Michigan closed, under advisories going into holiday weekend.

These issues underscore the need for all members to follow <u>water quality</u> <u>rules/guidelines</u> and to support the recently formed Winans Lake Drainage District, which will finally address the drainage and sedimentation issues that have been plaguing our lake for decades.

To avoid issues with algae and bacteria, members should avoid using fertilizer, clean up pet waste and discourage geese from the lake.



Members should also be aware that once water quality degrades past a certain point, it becomes practically impossible to recover and very expensive to manage. For example, other lakes in our area spend 2-5x or more than we do for aquatic nuisance (weed) control.
