Goose Roundup

To all concerned Lake residents that have kayaks and are active lake users. WLA has received a State Permit for a Goose Roundup this year. We have reserved Sat morning, June 25th, at 8am with the GooseBuster Co. to come to Winans Lake to round up our geese. I have been scouting the lake most every evening and I am seeing a steady count of 7. A family of 5, and a couple of adults. The geese will begin the molting process soon and should be flightless by the end of June. In the mean time, we may have an influx of geese looking to find a safe place to stay over for the flightless month of July. If they arrive, we are stuck with them for the summer.

Please set aside about 2 hours on Sat morn, June 25th to meet at the Beach at 8am, in your kayak, to help corral our geese, which will be safely removed. If we do not get more than our current total of 7 geese, we have the option to cancel with GooseBusters with no penalty. We won't know how many we will have until shortly before the Sat June 25th date. But, we need to be ready if we get a late arrival of geese. Please contact me if you are available for this activity as we are required to have enough volunteers to make the roundup work. Also, if you know of any other lake members who could help, please let them know.

Lake Treatment

Water Quality Committee

On Monday May 23rd Jack McAllen and Bruce Mendenhall placed fifty buoys that marked the drop-off edges, points, and underwater features to help direct Aquatic Technologies airboat for the lake treatment.

On Tuesday May 24th Jack McAllen rode the airboat to help the applier to properly navigate the buoy-marked path. The lake was fairly calm and the sun was bright and allowed good locating of Eurasian milfoil beds.

Granular 2-4-D was distributed along the buoy marked course. It sinks immediately and stays put. The effective bandwidth is about 130' wide at the lake bottom and is intense during a three-day time-release period. The general depth of the treatment zone is about nine to twenty feet deep.

On Wednesday May 25th Jack McAllen and Bruce Mendenhall picked up the marker buoys. They will be stored for use again next year.

We are slowly developing better control of the Milfoil infestation based upon a trend over the last three years of less chemical usage each year (5% to 10% reduction each year). Lake survey work in later June will reveal the true effectiveness of this spring treatment.

The current Eurasian milfoil beds will be slowly dying off.

Fish Study - Volunteers Needed!



Since it has been more than 30 years since our last lake study, the fish committee has concluded that more recent data should be obtained to assist the WLA in making effective fishery management decisions. Accordingly, the WLA board has commissioned our lake advisor, Dr. David Jude of Freshwater Physicians, to conduct a professional fish study of Bass, Pike and Bluegill. The study will determine the growth rates of these species to determine if there are any predator-prey imbalances or other ecosystem issues affecting our fishery. The results of the study will help guide the WLA in making fishery management decisions for the next several years.

The study involves taking scale samples and length measurements of bass, pike and bluegill to determine the growth rates in Winans Lake vs state averages. A minimum of 50 samples of each species across all age groups is required. The WLA has agreed to help in gathering the samples for this study in exchange for reduced cost, so we need the help of our angling community! Prizes will be awarded to the volunteers submitting the most samples by Sept 30 2016 or the first volunteers to submit 50 samples of a species. Please help!

For those who would like to assist us in sampling, here are the instructions:

- For each Bass, Pike or Bluegill caught, carefully remove 5-10 scales using forceps, tweezers, knife, etc. and
 measure the length of the fish as detailed below. Scales for bass and bluegill should be taken from under
 the spiny dorsal and below the lateral line. Scales for pike should be taken near the end of the pectoral fin
 and above the lateral line. If possible, lay the fish on a wet towel while you handle it to protect the fish's
 slimy layer. As always, bass and pike should be released unharmed.
- Place the scale samples for each fish in a separate baggie or envelope and record the species (bass, pike or bluegill), length, date and name of angler (optional) on the baggie/envelope with a permanent marker or other suitable means.
- Submit the samples to Greg Dygert, Frank Ferguson or any WLA board member.
