## **Beach Parking**

Even though we recently expanded the beach parking area by more than double, extremely high beach usage this summer is once again causing parking issues.



In order to minimize safety issues and inconvenience, beach-going members are asked to do the following:- Park centered within designated spaces whenever possible.- If all designated spaces are full, please make sure to park completely off the road in a safe manner without blocking traffic or other parked cars. Hamburg Twp Police may ticket violators. If parking outside of the lot, parking perpendicular to the utility pole barriers will help maximize available space.

- Car pool with neighbors and guests whenever possible.
- Do not leave your car parked in the lot after hours or if you are not presently using the beach. Violators may be towed at owner's expense.

## **WLA Rules**

Here is a reminder of pertinent summer-time lake rules to keep our summer activities and interactions on the lake pleasant.

- Only WLA members may place boats on the lake. Guests of WLA members shall not place a boat on the lake.
- Every watercraft must clearly display a valid WLA decal and WLA-assigned numbers on both sides near the bow. (Contact the WLA Board for boat number assignments and decals).
- Members and guests shall sign in each time they visit the beach.
- Bass over 18 inches and pike under 26 inches must be released. However, it is strongly recommended to release all bass and pike. *Note: due to the warm water temperatures; fish are just as stressed as we are - please release them quickly.*
- Swimming is not allowed at the access sites.
- To help maintain the natural character of the community and avoid "light pollution," all outdoor lighting shall be managed so that there is no glare beyond the property line. All special-purpose outdoor lighting (e.g., to illuminate swimming, skating, or deck areas) shall be turned off by 10 p.m.
- Fertilizer use is discouraged on lakefront properties and shall not be used within twenty-five (25) feet of the lake shore. If fertilizer is used, it must contain no phosphorus. (Fertilizers are labeled with a three-number system that indicates their quantity of nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium content. The middle number must be zero.)
