

2022 Annual WLA Meeting

The 2022 Annual meeting was held at LGCC on May 19th and was attended by 36 members. The WLA Board presented the financial status, reviewed the water quality status, and updated attendees on the Winans Lake drainage district status. The membership voted affirmatively on the two submitted proposals:

A proposal to increase dues \$10 per month to offset increasing costs in the general budget, support a transition to professional water quality management, fund beach house repairs and strengthen reserve funds.

A proposal to amend the bylaws to permit electronic voting; paper ballots will be provided to members who are currently receiving paper copies of the Winans Lake Views newsletter.

Additionally, Greg Dygert was reelected to the board and Trish Ibrahim joined the board. The current board members are listed below.

Water Quality Update Spring 2022

Winans Lake was chemically treated on May 31st to control invasive eurasian milfoil. Based on prior surveys, approximately 95 locations were treated with a 2,4-D based granular herbicide. This is essentially the same active ingredient used in lawn products to control broadleaf weeds, but in this case the herbicide is encased in a clay pellet so that it rapidly sinks to



the bottom of the lake and releases slowly near the roots of the plants. This is a systemic herbicide, which means that when it gets taken up by the plant it kills the whole plant, not just the portions that are contacted. Properties within 100 ft of treated areas and access sites were posted with signs indicating certain watering restrictions.

The amount of milfoil observed this spring seemed a bit more than usual, which was somewhat surprising based on the small amount that was leftover last fall after 2021 treatments. The lake will be surveyed again in this summer to determine the effectiveness of the spring treatment and locate any areas that may have been missed. Subsequent treatments will likely be required this year using a different but similar herbicide (triclopyr) to help ensure that we are not developing plants with a resistance to any one herbicide.

Longer term, the WLA will be working lake experts to evaluate the use of a relatively new herbicide, Procellacor, which promises to provide more effective and longer term control with a good safety profile. While this a more expensive herbicide, it can potentially lead to lower cost over time due to reduced treatments

Invasive milfoil has a tendency to grow at lower water temperatures and lower light levels than other plants and can grow up to 3 inches per day. This gives it a competitive advantage over native plants which can allow it to quickly dominate the ecosystem, leading to reduced habitat and impeded access. This is why it is so important to keep this invasive plant under control.

On another topic, several members have voiced concerns about the amount of yellow-green material floating on the lake near the shorelines this year. This material was determined to a be a mixture of algae, pollen, cottonwood fuzz and road dust and has since dissipated due to recent rains and winds. A certain amount of algae is a natural occurrence this time of year as the water warms. However, excessive algae degrade water quality and are an indicator of too many nutrients (i.e. phosphorous and nitrogen) entering the system, usually via stormwater runoff. The recently approved Winans Lake Drain should help to limit the amount of these and other contaminants washing into the lake once it is implemented. As always,



members are urged to avoid unnecessary use of fertilizer and avoid placing any other organic materials in or near the lake.





Winans Women Walking
