Canada Geese and Water Quality

This is the time of year that geese show up in numbers looking for a comfortable place to nest and stay the summer. While some may consider geese to be an interesting part of the wildlife scene, they are actually one of the more serious threats to our water quality.

Goose droppings contain harmful bacteria, which can cause illness and potentially force the beach and lake to be closed to swimming if levels get too high. This happens every year on nearby lakes. Goose droppings also present an additional nutrient load to the lake, leading to other water quality problems such as excessive weed growth something the WLA has been working diligently to control at great expense. In addition to the obvious mess, goose droppings on the ground are also unsanitary and are especially hazardous to children and pets.



Due to the bird flu, the DNR is limiting the number of relocation permits again this year. Accordingly, it is even more important that all members cooperate in keeping geese off our lake by actively harassing them and discouraging them from congregating and nesting on or near the lake. Under no circumstances should geese or other waterfowl be fed. WLA rules prohibit feeding and harboring waterfowl and will be strictly enforced since roundup is not currently an option. Please do your part in helping to keep Winans Lake clean and swimmable.

Attempted Theft

A resident on Pleasant Lake Drive reported that on February 10th or 11th between 9 pm and 6 am a vehicle that was parked in his driveway was unlawfully entered and that the glove box contents were searched and scattered on the floor and seat in an apparent attempted theft.
